## Who needs a visa?

A list of countries that require a visa, i.e. countries that do not require a visa to enter the Republic of Germany

- Nationals from outside the EU, except Switzerland, Iceland, Liechtenstein and Norway
- After entering, citizens from the following countries can apply for a visa: Australia, Israel, Japan, Canada, the Republic of Korea, New Zealand, and the U.S. as well as citizens from Andorra, Brazil, El Salvador, Honduras, Monaco and San Marino
- In all other cases a visa is required **before entering**! A residency permit extension is also <u>not</u> possible even when entering with a tourist or Schengen visa!

## Necessary documents and requirements:

- Register residence in the citizen's office with valid passport or passport substitute
- A biometric passport photo (photo machines can also be found at the Foreigners' Registration Office)
- Proof of sufficient financing for living expenses: <u>savings account</u> of a German bank with a minimum of € 10,332 (a maximum amount of € 861 may be withdrawn by the account holder in one sum per calendar month), or a <u>declaration of commitment</u> or calculation of need (in individual cases), for example by declaration of cost absorption, scholarship commitment, formal declaration of commitment.
- Health insurance certificate (insurance card) from a public health insurance or from a travel health insurance (e.g. <u>Klemmer</u> or <u>Care-Concept</u>) for the duration of the language course.
- Proof that you are attending / will attend a German language course: at least 20 45-minute classroom hours per week with mandatory regular attendance
- <u>German classes for non-university students</u>: the length of stay is a maximum of 12 months. No extensions / No employment allowed
- <u>German classes for university students</u> (applicants for a place at university): a residency permit for university preparation is a maximum of 2 years after entering. Requirement: a high school diploma and an official letter of accreditation for it.
- Important information: A language course visa cannot be changed into a visa for studying at university. The visa is generally issued for 3 months (90 days). Within this period of time an issuance of a residency permit must be applied for. If you want to study in Germany after the language course, then you should also state this in your visa application.

## **Requirements for a German intensive course certificate from Tandem in Munich:**

- A completed registration form with your passport number and place of birth
- A payment of € 200 for each month registered. In order to grant a visa, some German Embassies expect the course fee to be paid in full in advance.
